

Lend OR Borrow?

LEND significa **emprestar algo** para alguém. Ou seja, você empresta algo para outra pessoa usar por um tempo.



I will **lend** you my book.

He **lent** me his pencil yesterday.



Can you **lend** me your phone for a second?



I can't **lend** you my car today.



BORROW significa **pegar algo emprestado** de alguém. Ou seja, você recebe algo para usar temporariamente.



She **borrowed** my headphones last week.

They want to **borrow** some money from me.



I need to **borrow** her laptop this weekend.



She **borrow**s my highlighters every class.
